
Restorative Justice at NCHS

- Submitting Attendance sheets in their classrooms


Failure to adhere to the above policies may result:

Chronic absenteeism means missing too much school—for any reason—excused or unexcused.

- 10% or more instructional days missed OR 10 consecutive instructional days missed
- In Seat Attendance (Dis/Engagement)

Free (remote) Adult Education classes at RiseBoro including:

1.- Free High School Equivalency (HSE)exam preparation . English and Spanish

In NYC the High School dropout rate is around 10%. Many students don't graduate from High School because they didn't see the benefit of it at the moment or many drop out simply because they have to. For a number of different reasons, they just urgently need to get a job.

The reality is that to have a high school diploma is very important! Will improve chances to get better job opportunities. People who do not have diplomas usually make less money and also run into a series of difficulties when applying to social services in NYC.

2. - Free English as a Second Language (ESL) classes (Level I - Level VI)

These classes are for non-native speakers to improve listening, speaking, reading and writing. Riseboro helps adult students improve their communication skills in English and also participate in the cultural and social activities within the classroom.

Enrollment is currently open and classes typically meet two times a week in the afternoons (6 pm to 9 pm) depending on the level of the student. Most classes are being held remotely due the Coronavirus Pandemic.

Alternate Eligibility Prerequisites for Spring 2021 Applicants

In response to the Department of Education's cancellation of spring SATs and June/January 2020 Regents exams, College Now will move toward a proficiency index to determine students' eligibility for our spring 2021 courses. We will consider a combination of students' overall HS GPAs, subject-area GPAs and/or PSAT scores for college-credit course eligibility in lieu of standardized exam scores. Therefore, if you have not taken the ELA Regents or SATs, and still wish to apply, we encourage you to submit your application, transcript and/or PSAT scores to our office for review. Please be advised that we will not consider any students with overall GPAs under 80%.
